CAPE provides professional development for teachers and their partner teaching artists, planning time, and individual coaching with staff to develop each project. Projects are crafted anew each year.


After-School Programs: CAPE's after-school program begins with a foundation of arts integration (art + academics) and regularly expands to include community involvement and public art projects.
